

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



I am directed to invite a reference on the subject mentioned Contempt Case (C) No. 689 of 2022 and to inform that the aforementioned matter came up for hearing before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi on 15.12.2022. Hon'ble High Court of Delhi during the course of pleadings took cognizance of the submissions made by the Learned Counsel for the Respondent No. 1, 3, 4, 5 that the contract is outsourced and despite several letters written to the contractor, directions have not been complied with. It is also submitted that Respondents have no means or ways to enforce the directions beyond this. Hon'ble High Court ordered:

".....Court is unable to appreciate this stand. Till the Court Order is vacated or modified, it has to be complied with. Let steps be taken by Respondent No. 1, 3, 4 and 5 to ensure compliance of order dated 31.05.2022 before the next date.

List on 22.12.2022".

2. To recall, this Institution on receipt of Hon'ble High Court's order dated 31.05.2022 forwarded a copy of the said order together with the list of 37 petitioners vide letter of even number dated 02.06.2022 to M/s Gorkha Security Services inter-alia requesting to comply with the directions of Hon'ble High Court envisaged in the aforementioned order, detailed as under:-

".... Taking into account the fact the petitioners are sanitation workers who have been discharging their duties for the last more than 12 years, it is directed that in case the respondents engage any new contractor for the same work(s) which the petitioners have been performing for the last many years, the respondents will direct the said contractor to engage the petitioners on the same terms and conditions as existing today without demanding any commission or premiums from them for such engagement".

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- 3. Though, this Institution had reminded your Company vide letters dated 08.06.2022; 13.06.2022; and 17.06.2022 and even a meeting under the Chairmanship of Director, Lady Hardinge Medical College & Allied Hospitals was convened on 18.06.2022 and the representative of your Company viz Shri V.K. Vashisht, Chief Executive Officer; Shri Sonu Kumar, authorized Signatory; Shri Jitender Tyagi, Field Officer; and Shri Dinesh Kumar, Advisor were present. However, the representative of your company had inter-alia sought two day's time to sort out the issue and assured to revert back with the decision but they filed an Misc. Application before the Hon'ble High Court to implead M/s Gorkha Security Services as a party.
- As of now, since the Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 15.12.2022 has categorically directed that ".... till the Court Order is vacated or modified, it has to be complied with. Let steps be taken by Respondent 1, 3, 4, and 5 [M/s Gorkha Security Services Respondent No. 5] to ensure compliance of order dated 31.05.2022 before the next date". The next date of hearing has been fixed on 22.12.2022. This Institution on receipt of Hon'ble High Court's order dated 15.12.2022 had contacted the representative of M/s Gorkha Security Services to convene an emergent meeting to ensure compliance of Hon'ble High Court's order dated 31.05.2012 read with 15.12.2022 but none of the representative is available either owing to the ill health or being out of station.
- In view of foregoing, it is to inform that since this Institution had awarded the contract for providing outsourced workmen for sanitation job to M/s Gorkha Security Services with effect from 01.06.2022 the onus lies upon M/s Gorkha Security Services being the Respondent No. 5 in the instant Writ Petition to engage the petitioners. Thus, it would be appropriate that the petitioners may be engaged in compliance of Hon'ble High Court's order dated 31.05.2022 so that a compliance report is placed before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi on the next date of hearing i.e. 22.12.2022.
