

A. Senior Resident Exam day Guidelines 2026

Date of written examination : 06-02-2026 Friday

Reporting time : 10:00 AM

NO ENTRY AFTER : 10:45 AM

Starting time of examination : 11:00 AM

Exam Concludes : 12:00 Noon

1. Download Admit Card from the website of the institute.
2. Candidates needs to carry the admit card (02 sets in Original) along with the passport size photographs and ID proof to the test centre.
3. Candidates must arrive at LHMC Foyer through Gate No. 02, at the reporting time, where the seating arrangement for the exam shall be displayed.
4. They must then proceed to the allotted exam venue as indicated.
5. Before the exam starts, candidates will be given 15 minutes to fill in their personal particulars in the exam booklet.
6. Candidates will have around 5 minutes to unseal the Question booklet, check the number of pages
7. Candidates must sign the Attendance sheet and OMR answer sheet.
8. Invigilators will announce the timing at the beginning, half-time, and towards the end of the exam.
9. Only Blue/Black Ball Point Pen will be permitted for used during the exam.
10. Before leaving the exam hall, candidates must submit their OMR sheet and the question paper to the invigilator.
11. The following items are barred inside exam centre.
 - a) Stationery items EXCEPT BLUE/BLACK BALL PEN like, sharpeners, geometry boxes, writing pads, calculator, log tables, etc.
 - b) Electronic devices such as mobile phones, pen drives, scanners, Bluetooth devices, earphones, microphones, pagers, health and related wearable accessories.
 - c) Accessories like goggles, handbags, wallets, belts, caps, watches/wrist watches, cameras, bracelets, etc.
 - d) Eatables such as open or packed food..
12. The exam centre is not responsible for the safekeeping of any of the candidate's belonging.

B. Instructions for the written examination on 06.02.2025

1. Syllabus of the exam shall be according to the post graduate exit exam for the respective subjects.
2. There will be a common entrance examination for the following subjects.
 - a) Paediatrics and Neonatology
 - b) Medicine and Neurology
 - c) Obstetrics and Gynaecology and OBG+IVF

Candidates will be asked to submit their preference of departments at the time of interview.

3. All candidates who have applied for Emergency Medicine along with another department will appear in the exam for both subjects. Exam for Emergency Medicine will be held after the time for previous exam is over. Likewise, all the candidate who have applied for Pathology and Blood Bank will appear in the both exams. Exam for Blood Bank will be held after the time for previous exam is over.
4. The written examination shall be of 60 single response MCQs. For each question there will be only one correct answer and three other options as distractors.
5. Each correct response will carry 4 marks and wrong answer will fetch-1 (minus 1) mark.
6. In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks in written test, candidates older in age will be given preference to determine the inter-merit order.
7. During the course of, before or after the examination, if a candidate indulges in any of the below mentioned activities, he/she shall be deemed to have adopted unfair practice and booked under UNFAIR MEANS (UFMS) case. The candidate would be debarred and shall also be liable for criminal action and/or any other action as deemed fit.
8. Use of unfair means or malpractice which allows a candidate to gain an undue advantage over other candidates includes, [but is not limited to]:
 - a. Being in possession of any item or article which has been prohibited or can be used unfairly, including any stationery item;
 - b. Using someone to write examination (impersonation) or preparing material for copying;
 - c. Breaching examination rules or any direction issued by the Institute;
 - d. Assisting other candidates to engage in malpractices;
 - e. Writing question or answers on any material with him/her;
 - f. Contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the Examination Staff, during the examination time in the examination centre.

- g. Threatening any of the officials connected with the conduct of the examination or threatening any of the candidates or using violence against anyone;
- h. Using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination;
- i. Manipulation and fabrication of online document viz. admit card, rank letter, self-declaration, etc;
- j. Forceful entry/exit in/from Examination Centre/Hall;
- k. Use or attempted use of any electronic device after entering the examination Centre;
- l. Affixing/uploading of wrong/morphed photographs on the application form/ admit card proforma;
- m. Creating obstacles in smooth and fair conduct of examination or creating disturbance to others inside the examination hall/room/centre.
- n. Making an approach or attempting to influence the outcome of the result after the examination.

9. Cancellation of Result

The result of the candidates who indulge in unfair means/malpractice will be cancelled and will not be declared.
